

MRS Prerequisite: Social Science

Courses in areas such as Sociology, Economics, Social Geography, Political Science, Anthropology, Women's Studies, Criminology and some Nutritional Sciences can be used to satisfy the Social Science prerequisite requirement. Acceptable courses will focus on the study of society and the manner in which people behave and influence the world beyond the individual's immediate experience. In most cases, if the institution that offers the course has categorized the course as Social Science, it will be acceptable to satisfy the Social Sciences prerequisite requirement.

Prerequisite courses must be part of (or transferable to) an undergraduate degree program; we are not able to consider diploma or certificate program courses for admission purposes.

If you are unsure if a course you have completed, or plan to complete, will be appropriate for admission purposes, please forward the course code and course syllabus (if available) to mrs.admissions@utoronto.ca for review.

MRS is a second-entry program which requires previous university experience. To be eligible for admission applicants must have completed at least one full year (equivalent to 5.0 U of T credits) of university degree studies (with a cGPA of B- or higher) including a single-semester course (0.5 credit course) in Biology, Math, Physics and a Social Science. Prerequisite courses must be part of (or transferable to) an undergraduate degree program; we are not able to consider diploma or certificate program courses for admission purposes. Applicants seeking admission to the Nuclear Medicine & Molecular Imaging Technology (NMMIT) stream must also present Grade 12 Chemistry, or equivalent.
